



495 Express Lanes Northern Extension Project (495 NEXT)

- Approx. \$660 million, 2.5-mile extension of 495 Express Lanes from Dulles Corridor interchange to George Washington Memorial Parkway (GWMP) near the American Legion Bridge
- Public-private partnership project between VDOT and Transurban through 2087
- Express Lanes scheduled to open late 2025
- Project completion in mid-2026








General Purpose and Express Lanes Access


Environmental and Sustainability Commitments

- Transurban provided \$1.387M to Fairfax County for restoring approximately 3,000 linear feet of Scott's Run
- Stabilize stream banks at two locations along Scott's Run



Fairfax County Park Authority Replacement Land

- Create parking and trail connection to Scott's Run and new bike-pedestrian trail
- VDOT Maintenance Yard with privacy fence next to park







Clearing Activities and Revegetation Plan

Clearing and Tree Removal

Clearing began Summer 2022, 95% complete as of Dec. 2023

Revegetation Plan

- Conceptual revegetation plan available in spring 2024, with highlights shown at public meetings in April
- To be implemented after construction within 495 NEXT corridor where space allows



Construction Sequence

- Started construction: March 2022
- Remove noise walls and clear trees to widen Beltway: late 2022-early 2024
- Install drainage, perform earthwork, construct new lanes outside current I-495 alignment: 2023-2024
- Shift traffic to outside lanes to enable construction of inside lanes: late
 2024-early 2025
- Open Express Lanes: late 2025
- Complete overall project: mid 2026

Drainage and Stormwater Management Facilities

- Over two miles of drainage pipe installed in 2023, will continue through 2024
 - Now to mid 2024: Grade periphery of existing Beltway to uniform elevation, install replacement waterline and drainage, construct retaining walls
- Three stormwater management facilities
 - Stormwater management pond (SWM) near George Washington Memorial Parkway interchange operating as a sediment basin, will be converted into SWM pond in final phase of project
 - Two ponds remain in progress
- Coordination with National Park Service (NPS)
 - Very little amount of drainage infrastructure and no stormwater infrastructure present on NPS boundaries
 - No SWM facilities or related easements/right of way necessary with the project
 - Responsive to and coordinating closely with NPS for any construction on NPS right of way
- All stormwater infrastructure within VDOT right of way is designed and reviewed per VDOT and/or Virginia Department of Environmental Quality standards
- Stormwater designs are being coordinated with Maryland for their design plans north of the river
- No roadway construction for Virginia (beyond ITS and signage) north of project terminus
- DEQ regulations (following Federal guidance) identify phosphorus as benchmark pollutant for VSMP/SWM and water quality design criteria; Virginia does not have a separate regulation on salt application for snow hazard mitigation





Bridge Construction

- Replace old bridges with upgraded new bridges featuring wider sidewalks and trail connections
 - Live Oak Drive
 - Georgetown Pike
 - Old Dominion Drive
- Improve existing Lewinsville Road bridge
 - Widen sidewalk
- Install additional ramp and Beltway bridges
 - Two overpasses for George Washington Memorial Parkway to southbound I-495 ramp
 - I-495 bridges over Scott's Run
 - Overpass for I-495 South to Georgetown Pike ramp
 - Two overpasses for Dulles Toll Road to I-495 North ramp
 - Overpass for I-495 North bridge over Dulles Toll Road ramp





Bridge Construction Work Sequence

- Drive piles, complete abutments: early/mid 2024
- Lift and place girders (overnights, requires multilane closures and intermittent traffic stoppages on Beltway):
 - Georgetown Pike: late March/early April
 - Live Oak Drive: early/mid-April
 - Old Dominion Drive: fall 2024
- Install deck, barriers, signage and lane markings:
 mid-late 2024
- Switch traffic onto new bridges; demolish old bridges: late 2024-early 2025

Live Oak Drive Construction

Remaining Work Sequence

- Demolish existing barrier walls across from Langley Swim & Tennis Club
- Complete waterline and drainage work
- Perform earthwork to level short length of Live Oak Drive to be shifted slightly west
- Install road foundation, pave and mark short length of Live Oak Drive
- Switch traffic: April/May 2024
- Demolish retired pavement
- Construct retaining walls to enable GW Parkway ramps to be built

Georgetown Pike Bridge Construction

Work Sequence

- Place girders: late March/early April
- Install deck, barriers, signage and lane markings: spring/summer 2024
- Switch traffic onto new northern portion of bridge: summer 2024
- Demolish existing southern portion of bridge:
 late 2024
- Complete new southern portion of bridge:
 mid 2025
- Switch traffic onto final configuration of bridge: late 2025







Noise Wall Progress

- Noise wall construction: early 2023
 - early 2025
- Progress as of March 2024:
 - More than 56 sections of new noise wall installed on northbound I-495 between Old Dominion Drive and Georgetown Pike
 - Awaiting installation of noise wall panels, more than 130 noise wall posts mounted between Old Dominion Drive and Live Oak Drive bridges

What Neighbors Should Expect

- Pile driving and other noise-producing work
- Lane shifts on the Beltway, ramps and adjacent local roads
- Mid-day and overnight lane and shoulder closures on the Beltway, ramps and adjacent local roads
- Brief total traffic stoppages on the Beltway to install bridge girders and perform bridge demolition
- Brief overnight closures of bridges (Georgetown Pike, Live Oak Drive, Old Dominion Drive)
- Overnight bridge demolition and sawcutting (infrequent)

Traffic Operations and Incident Management

Local Network Operations and Traffic Analysis

Mitigation Strategies Implemented at Georgetown Pike

- Monitoring and adjusting traffic signal timing at Georgetown Pike and Balls Hill Road
- Moved stop bar at Georgetown Pike and northbound I-495 ramp
- Repainted cross hatching at Georgetown Pike and Balls Hill Road intersection
- Funding and coordination with Fairfax County Police Department for increased on-site presence
- Supplemental safety service patrol on I-495







Fairfax Connector Runs on 495 Express Lanes

New commuter bus service between Tysons and Bethesda launching this spring

- Route 798 will be operated by Fairfax Connector
- 495 NEXT funded \$5.2M for purchasing buses
- Transurban to provide \$2.2M per year for bus service operations
- Route will run on the 495 Express Lanes and over the American Legion Bridge









VDOT Coordination with Maryland

- VDOT currently focused on signage agreement for Virginia's 495 NEXT project
- Bi-state agreement will define how Virginia's 495 NEXT project and Maryland's American Legion Bridge and I-270 Corridor Program will interface
 - VDOT continues to coordinate and collaborate with Maryland and Fairfax County to ensure best outcome for the public
